

ICELANDIC ADVENTURES

In February of this year I went on an 11-day photography tour with Iceland-Photo-Tours. There were just four of us with our tour guide, Christopher Lund. Chris is a native Icelander and professional photographer.



The tour included Vatnajokull National Park, Diamond Beach, Jokulsarlon Glacier Lagoon, the east coast, the Myvatn Region and a stop on the west coast. We drove what is known as the Ring Road, starting out on the south coast shooting two waterfalls, Seljalandsfoss and Skogafoss. Then on to Black Sand Beach, Reynisfara, shooting the sea stacks formed by volcanic activity.



The second day was an exciting one...Diamond Beach, where icebergs from the calving Breidamerkurjokull Glacier float out to the ocean through a lagoon and then wash up on the beach. We wore knee high rubber boots so we could shoot closer to the large icebergs and catch the patterns in the black sand around the icebergs as the waves receded. Unfortunately for me a sneaker wave washed a small iceberg into my tripod, knocking us both

over, ruining my camera and lens and breaking the bottom third of one leg off my tripod. Ian, in our group, also fell and his camera and lens were ruined. Our guide took us back to the Guesthouse to change into dry clothes. Later our guide ordered new equipment for us from a store in Reykjavik, which caught up with us at a couple of different airports a few days later. I was glad I had a backup camera but was limited to my fixed 55mm and a wide angle lens in the meantime.



The rest of the trip included Glacier Lagoon, two ice caves on the glacier, black sand dunes with Vestrahorn Mountain in the background, stopping to shoot Icelandic horses, various stops along the scenic coast, and then inland to the Myvatn Region. In that region we visited two more waterfalls, Godafoss and Aldeyjarfoss.



Our days were so busy that time seemed to fly by and all of a sudden it was our last day and we were heading back to Rekjavik. We talked our guide into stopping to shoot an interesting church along the way and we stopped to shoot the 45 meter sea stack called Hvitserkur on the northern coast.

I would only go with a tour guide in the winter. I recommend this tour company but know that the 11 day tour is actually 9 days, day 1 being meeting for dinner and day 11 having breakfast and departing. We stayed at nice hotels. With a few exceptions our meals were gourmet, although only breakfasts and the first and last night's dinners were included. Even my quesadilla at a gas station convenience store was good. All food and merchandise in Iceland is expensive. They have a very short growing season so almost everything is imported. The only complaint I/we had is the tour's website leads you to believe that you'll be riding in a large 4WD vehicle with 2 seats per person. We were in a 6 or 7 passenger 4WD Volkswagon van.



After the tour I stayed in Rekjavik 2 more days to shoot the iconic Voyageur sculpture, Hallgrimskirkja (church), Harpa (the modern opera house) and wall murals etc. I would love to visit Iceland again but in a warmer month and I would rent a car and travel on my own.


EDWIN VASQUEZ - AV ART COMMUNITY REPORT

Chris Wilkins lead the 'Brown Bag' lunch, with club reps who represented S4C clubs.


